UPDATE REPORT ON ACTIONS RELATED TO THE AUDIT ON GOVERNANCE ARRANGEMENTS DURING COVID AND THE FIELD HOSPITAL ASSURANCE REVIEW

1. INTRODUCTION

This report provides the Audit Committee with an update on the actions undertaken to meet the findings of two key audits in respect of the Health Board's COVID-19 response.

The first action plan relates to the Internal Audit report, "Governance arrangements during COVID-19 Pandemic – Advisory Review). The second action plan relates to the follow up review undertaken by the Welsh Government Integrated Assurance Hub in respect of Field Hospital development.

2. BACKGROUND

Governance arrangements during COVID-19 Pandemic – Advisory Review (internal audit)

The Audit Committee received the "Governance arrangements during COVID-19 Pandemic – Advisory Review" at its September 2020 meeting and a report actions of against this plan was requested. This report is attached as **Appendix 1**.

The report was very welcome and covered a wide range of aspects of the Health Board's COVID-19 governance response. To remind the Committee the report covered the following areas, not all of which required action as no findings were required.

In receiving the report, the Committee was advised that: -

• The COVID-19 report was positive and it highlighted that effective action had been taken;

- Feedback from independent members was positive and the board arrangements were organized well;
- Good communication and digital arrangements were in place;
- Record keeping consistency and quality was the main theme within the recommendations.

In order to ensure that the findings of the report are effectively actioned and embedded in Health Board practice, a detailed action plan has been developed which covers all of the areas within the report. This action plan is attached for the Committee's consideration at **Appendix 2**.

It has already been agreed with internal audit colleagues that a follow up review on this important area would be beneficial and discussions are planned to be held at the end of November 2020 to scope the range of the follow up audit with a view field work commencing immediately thereafter.

The Swansea Bay University Health Board advisory report sits alongside reports received by all other health bodies in Wales. Through work carried out by NHS Wales Shared Service, Directors of Finance received a summary set of findings compiled from the findings of all of the reviews and these will also be tested locally n Swansea Bay to determine if further learning can be gained from these national findings.

Field Hospital Follow Up Review (WGIAH)

At the September Committee members received the Field Hospital Project Assessment Review report received by the Health Board following the work undertaken by the WGIAH. The Committee also received a point in time update on the actions being undertaken to address the findings of this report.

On 12th October 2020 the WGIAH revisited the Health Board to undertake follow up work on the actions put in place to address the findings of the original report. At the time of the follow up review the Health Board provided the review team with an updated action plan backed up with a suite of evidence. The review team undertook a range of interviews with Welsh Government and Health Board members of staff on 12th October 2020 and findings report was issued at the end of that day. A copy of the final report is attached at **Appendix 3** for the Committee's consideration.

As a result of the follow up review, the WGIAH stated in their follow up report that action had been taken to substantially complete or progress all recommendations from the previous assurance review and much work has been undertaken to establish revised operational plans (having vacated Llandarcy Field Hospital) for mobilising the first phase of the Bay Field Hospital. The WGIAH increased their confidence delivery assessment from amber/red to amber and issued a further report. The action plan to address the follow up findings is attached to this report as **Appendix 4**.

The Field Hospital Operational Group, reporting to the Field Hospital Establishment Group remains the group responsible for the oversight of the delivery of the action plan. The Committee will note from the detail contained within the action plan that five of the eight findings have already been addressed since the receipt of the report and planned actions in place to move forward on the three outstanding items.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

The Health Board recognises and accepts the findings both reports and has arrangements in place to address the findings of each through detailed action plans.

Further updates on progress with the delivery of the action plans will be brought to future Audit Committees for assurance.
