# 2. KEY UPDATES

## **Appointment of Chair**

Following the interviews for the role of health board chair in January 2020, the announcement of the outcome is expected imminently.

### **University Member**

A recommendation has been made to the Minister for Health and Social Care as to the new University Independent Member, and the board will be kept apprised of progress.

#### **Associate Board Member**

The health board received the news at its last meeting that Alison Stokes had stepped down as chair of the Stakeholder Reference Group and subsequently as an associate board member. I would like to the opportunity to formally express my thanks to her for her contributions during her time with us and wish her well for the future.

### **Internal Commitments**

Since the last meeting, I had a bi-monthly update on the work of the Guardian Service, which is making significant progress in providing an environment in which staff feel comfortable in raising concerns. I also chaired a recruitment panel for consultant radiologist posts, which is always a great opportunity to hear why people are interested in joining the health board.

I was delighted to welcome the Chair of Cardiff and Vale University Health Board, who visited our Rapid Diagnostic Centre at Neath Port Talbot Hospital. This is a fantastic service, initiated by our clinicians, which provides a one stop shop for patients referred by GPs with a suspected but non specific cancer suspicion. I also had the chance to visit the cardiology department at Morriston Hospital to meet some of our staff within this service. I was incredibly impressed by the dedication and enthusiasm of those I met, and both visits gave me much food for thought.

Most recently, I very much enjoyed reviewing the nominations, and selecting the winner, of the chair's award, for the Living our Values Awards, and I am very much looking forward to meeting them and the rest of the winners at the ceremony.

### Local External Relationships

I attended the Swansea By City Region Joint Committee meeting at the end of January. Good progress is being made with all projects, with the Wellness Village project business case planned to be presented in Spring 2020, and the Homes as

Power Stations business case in February.

There were Public Services Board meetings for both Swansea and Neath Port Talbot in February. The Future Generations Commissioner attended the Neath Port Talbot meeting, and it was good to hear her perspectives.

I have had various communications with Assembly Members on specific and more general issues. It is my intention to look at how we can have a more ongoing conversation, particularly during the next few weeks and months.
