Summary of matters considered by the Health Professional Forum at its meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2022

## 1. Recovery & Sustainability Plan

The HPF received a presentation from Head of IMTP Development and Implementation in Strategy on our Board approved & WG submitted Recovery & Sustainability (R&S) Plan 2023/24-2025/26.

HPF accepted the R&S Plan and were reassured that the appetite & drive for investing in transformation plan.

The HPF representatives feedback that Board should be mindful of barriers to delivery in areas like recruitment specifically band matching stage.

The HPF did feedback they would like more engagement on the plan during the development stage for the 2024/25 plan.

The HPF discussed a Therapies representative to address cross cutting issues. Christine Morrell informed group this is being considered by Board.

The HPF feedback that the R&S plan is a primary reference document for this group so needs continuous engagement to support development of next year's plan.

#### 2. Planned Care

The HPF received a presentation from Craige Wilson (CW), Deputy COO on Planned Care Programme.

CW set out the ministerial ambitions, SBUHB performance trajectories & information covering 2022-2023 & Planned Care Recovery schemes & plans for 2023/24.

The HPF was informed of reduction in funding for recovery schemes & focus shift to regional programmes.

The HPF pleased to see positive direction & aims for this years & also that HB recognises limitations on what is possible & mitigating actions.

## 3. Board update

The HPF received a highlight report from the Board meeting on March 2023 & draft agenda for May 2023.

Research & Development Strategy coming to highlight for engagement.

The HPF members were encouraged to review plans submitted & for submission in May.

The HPF will consider Population Health Strategy at one of their future meetings.

# 4. HPF operating arrangements, duties & membership

The HPF is working to improve its membership & engagement with our community partners. The HPF were aware that again they were discussing plans that have already been submitted.

The HPF needs to be considered a key stakeholder reference group to be engaged throughout development stage of HB strategies & plans to be able to fulfil its duty of offering being an advisory Forum to the HB. The HPF will consider planning & engagement arrangements.

The HPF representatives will consider reporting arrangement & information sharing within their areas.
