# MENTAL HEALTH & LEARNING DISABILITIES CARE AND TREATMENT PLAN – UPDATE

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

This report follows the last meeting of the Health Board Legislation Committee on 6/02/2020. NHS Wales Delivery Unit visited the Mental Health and Learning Delivery Unit in September 2018 and provided a report with key recommendations for care and treatment planning for both the Health Board and NHS Wales.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

This report has been written to provide a summary update to the Committee of the current actions being taken by the mental health localities of Swansea, Neath Port Talbot and the Learning Disabilities service. The action plans compiled from each of these areas addresses the recommendations around the quality of care and treatment planning and in addition ensuring that there is adherence to the legislation outlined in the All Wales Review of the Quality of Care and Treatment Planning (CTP) in Adult Mental Health Services 2018, undertaken by the NHS Wales Delivery Unit.

It is apparent that the Covid 19 pandemic has had an effect on a number of actions.

#### 3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

Locality action plans have been developed with monitoring arrangements in place to ensure completion dates against each objective. Monitoring arrangements include

## Outcome measures and formulation for CTPs using SMART objectives

Refresher training plans ongoing in all localities although no further development and progress re the delivery of joint health and local authority training programmes due to COVID pandemic. Monitoring arrangements provided through CTP audit and caseload supervision continue in each of the service areas.

#### Risk Management within CTPs

WARRN training continues within the Delivery Unit. The use of WARRN has been evident in recent Serious Incident reviews. Bi-annual locality audits of CTPs using peer reviewers being undertaken as part of the educational framework with quarterly progress updates being provided to Locality Board. Other monitoring arrangements include supervision records in addition to training records are in place in each of the service areas

# Full MDT input included in CTPs

Task and Finish Groups established to examine the current CTP review documentation. Clear guidelines given to all staff e.g. team managers, clinical leaders indicating that the MDT review process is to be the default position. Training has been curtailed due to COVID but Swansea have indicated that more participation is required with carer involvement when reviews of CTPs take place. CTP construction with service users. CTP reviews are now taking place away from outpatient clinics.

## Quality of CTPs

Refresher training framework developed to consider the CTP being central to care planning (one overarching plan of care) through the Learning and Development team. In addition a working group has been set up to identify an appropriate and uniformed way of sharing documentation between different clinical areas. Monitoring arrangements through quarterly updates from the working group to the Locality Board. CTP audit and caseload supervision with a review of current system with identified changes and actions. A local engagement strategy is being developed to ensure that all CTPs are person centred and will involve service user groups, third sector and advocacy groups.

All of the action plans submitted from each of the areas have identified:

- 1. Objectives
- 2. Actions
- 3. Accountability through identified team/individual leads
- 4. Start date
- 5. Projected completion dates
- 6. Completion date
- 7. Monitoring arrangements.

The COVID outbreak has meant that that although risk management training has been impacted. More development has been identified in the need to develop and improve on the quality of relapse indicators for patients.
