Any change to MCA in practice impacts on all elements of care planning and service delivery across the Service delivery units.

Currently the management of this is split between the following:

- Delivery of staff training sits with Corporate safeguarding
- Management of the IMCA services sits within Corporate Nursing
- Management of Deprivation of Liberty Processes (one element of the MCA Act) sits with Primary Care, Community and Therapies unit
- Staff competency and management of capacity and consent sits with each SDU
- Management of Court of Protection work sits with Corporate Governance and each of the SDU Governance teams.

There is currently a Health Board wide sub group of the Mental health and Legislative committee in place that has been meeting regularly to consider future needs to successfully implement LPS once it is launched. This will from one vehicle to encourage feedback to the consultation to support a HB wide response. However, attendance is variable and limited from some of the key SDU's. While it is understandable due to operational pressures and the ongoing impact of Covid - 19, it is important to ensure Heads of Service are aware of and understand the implications for their service and ensure any comments / concerns or feedback are fed into the HB response.
