TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE MENTAL HEALTH LEGISLATION COMMITTEE

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the report is to set out the terms of reference for the Mental Health Legislation Committee for approval.

2. BACKGROUND

In line with standing orders (and the health board's scheme of delegation), the board nominated a committee to be known as the Mental Health Legislation Committee. As such, terms of reference were developed to set out its role, responsibility and operating arrangements.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

The terms of reference are required to be reviewed annually in-line with the health board's governance framework and good governance principles. Failure to do so could result in the committee not discharging its duties appropriately putting the health board's governance arrangements at risk.

There are no suggested changes to the content of the terms of reference. The committee's remit is to focus on mental health legislation therefore nothing needs to be changed in this respect.

All committee terms of reference are under review to ensure consistency of standard areas. This has resulted in the heading of some of the sections changing and others combined to make one section. This has had no impact on the content of the document. All changes are formatting related.
