PERFORMANCE SECTION OF ANNUAL REPORT 2018-19

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the report is to present the draft performance section for the organisational annual report for 2018-19.

2. BACKGROUND

The NHS Wales 2018-2019 manual for accounts sets out that all NHS organisations are required to publish, as single document, a three part annual report and accounts which comprises:

- 1. the performance report;
- 2. the accountability report; and
- 3. the financial statements.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

Sections two and three will be considered in draft by the Audit Committee on 16th May 2019 before the final versions are agreed by a special meeting of the health board on 29th May 2019.

The timescale for production of the annual report, into which section one is incorporated, varies from that of the accountability report and it must be produced in time for presentation at the annual general meeting in July 2019, having been reviewed by the Wales Audit Office (WAO) and translated into Welsh in advance of publication.

As such, it was considered to be good governance for the committee to receive a draft version of the performance section in May 2019, followed by a finalised version along with the sustainability report in June 2019. A draft performance section is attached as **Appendix A.**

There is also a requirement to share a draft of the performance section with Welsh Government by 31st May 2019 ahead of final submission of the report as set out above.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS
