TRANSFORMING CLINICAL SERVICES – HYWEL DDA CLINICAL SERVICES STRATEGY

1. INTRODUCTION

This report notifies the Board of the publication of Hywel Dda University Health Board's Clinical Services Strategy "Transforming Clinical Services" for formal public consultation, and the actions undertaken to enable the Health Board to respond.

2. BACKGROUND

Hywel Dda University Health Board started having discussions with the public in 2017 about what they wanted from their local health service in an engagement exercise called The Big Conversation. Since then, they have been considering what they were told, and discussing this, as well as the challenges and opportunities in providing health and care in the area, with local healthcare professionals.

As a result of this, the Health Board has developed a Clinical Services Strategy [Transforming Clinical Services](#). The consultation runs from 19th April until the 12th July 2018. Three main proposals are being consulted upon, all of which will have some impact, to a greater or lesser degree on ABMU Health Board, particularly Morriston Hospital.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

The proposals put forward by Hywel Dda University Health Board are focused on supporting people receive more care in their local communities, and with strengthened integrated services. There are, however, proposals to change hospital services, with three potential options being consulted upon. As set out above, each of these will impact on ABMU Health Board, and particularly Morriston Hospital.

The Health Board is working closely with Hywel Dda UHB to determine the impacts of each of the potential options on the Health Board. Hywel Dda Health Board will also be organising some staff engagement sessions at Morriston Hospital to enable staff to hear the proposals at first hand, and to comment on them.

Whilst there will be an impact in terms of more patients needing care at Morriston Hospital, this will also help Morriston strength its position as the regional specialist centre in South West Wales. The Health Board also needs to consider the opportunities which the new models of care in Hywel Dda will provide, to enable some of the treatment currently delivered at Morriston to be provided more locally in peoples' communities.

We have arranged a joint Board discussion at the end of June, when the proposals can be presented to the full Board, and discussed jointly. We will be able to use the outcomes of this discussion, as well as the detailed analysis of the options to inform our response to the consultation.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications associated with this report, however, there will be financial implications associated with the implementation of the outcomes of the consultation.
