This is due to us needing to source multiple sets of patient notes from multiple health boards, reading through those notes to extract this information, checking GP records and also liaising with the renal registry. Less than 5 patients, we are unable to provide you with the exact number of patients as due to the low numbers, there is a potential risk of identifying individuals if this was disclosed. We are therefore withholding this detail under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This information is protected by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and

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	Data Protection Act 2018 and its disclosure would be contrary to the data protection principles and constitute as unfair and unlawful processing in regard to Articles 5, 6, and 9 of GDPR. This exemption is absolute and therefore there is no requirement to apply the public interest test.
VII. How many of the total patients currently under the care of your Trust/Service with C3 Glomerulopathy have proteinuria of >1g/day despite use of an ACE inhibitor or ARB?	This information is not held centrally, therefore to obtain this information would involve a manual trawl and search of records which we have estimated would significantly exceed the 18 hours limit set down by the FOI Act as the reasonable limit. This is due to us needing to source multiple sets of patient notes from multiple health boards, reading through those notes to extract this information, checking GP records and also liaising with the renal registry.
